

# TUALATIN HILLS WATER POLO CLUB (THWPC)

## CHAPERONE GUIDELINES

### RESPONSIBILITIES DURING TRAVEL:

- Supervise assigned athletes at all times. Enforce Tualatin Hills Water Polo Clubs (THWPC) guidelines for athletes.
- Chaperones are responsible for meeting all athletes and travelers at the pre-determined time, place and making sure all travel together as a team.
- Chaperone will make sure rules of majority are followed when deciding where to eat, travel; and make sure majority rules are followed and all athletes and drivers travel as a team.
- Chaperones are responsible for making sure the athletes have water with them, and snacks as appropriate depending on the tournament schedule, at the cost of the athletes.
- Chaperones are not responsible for athlete's possessions.

### RULES FOR SAFETY:

- No athlete will switch van assignments at any time during the tournament unless needed for logistical purposes. If chaperones decide a switch is needed, they will inform all chaperones, coaches, and athletes of the change.
- No athlete will switch rooming assignments during the tournament for any reason unless determined as necessary by the chaperones and coaches.
- No athlete will room with an adult chaperone or coach that is not their parent, unless prior written authorization has been received from the athlete's parents.
- The athletes and chaperones will travel everywhere as a team whenever possible. Decisions on how to spend free time are made as a team and majority rules.
- The Coaches decides curfew and lights-out times for all athletes.
- The chaperones will check on all athletes during free time and after curfews given by the coach and make sure they follow those times. All chaperones will report to the coaches if they feel rules were not followed and/or misconduct has occurred while athletes are not at a pool or on deck.
- All chaperones will make periodic room check for all athletes.
- All chaperones will check all athletes' rooms before departure for any left items and to check the condition of the rooms, ensuring the athletes have left their rooms in the same condition as when they arrived.
